## Owls finally have a true home field

was preparing his Owls (0-5) for their stadium opener against Western Kentucky (1-4) when the statue was unveiled. He called the statue "flattering."


Although his original hopes for a domed stadium didn't pan out, Schnellenberger joked: "My dream fell on deaf ears. ... Hallelujah. Amen. Glory be. The university dispelled my first thoughts and came up with their own."

The new stadium gives the Owls something they never had during their first 10 years of football, first as a Division I-AA school and the last six in college football's upper division: a true home field.

FAU first played its home games in Sun Life Stadium, which was often 90 percent empty for contests against teams like Marist, Albany and
